## **Current Launches Inaugural Chicago Water Week**

Chicago Water Week will highlight the city's innovative, cross-sector water leaders from September 28 to October 2, 2020

Chicago, IL, September 3, 2020 — Current, Chicago's nonprofit water innovation hub, announces the inaugural *Chicago Water Week* on Monday, September 28, 2020.

Five days of events and programming will educate participants about waterrelated challenges in the Chicago region and highlight leaders working to solve them.

Presentations will cover artificial intelligence in water research, jobs in the blue
economy, Lake Michigan water quality monitoring, investment trends, emerging
technologies, and more.

"Chicago's water assets stretch well beyond Lake Michigan and our rivers, meaning our water challenges can't be addressed by any one sector alone," said Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot. "By collaborating with our industry leaders, researchers, environmental advocates, start-ups, and utilities, we will further develop the economic strength and environmental resiliency we need to tackle these challenges head on. Week is an exciting, new opportunity for us to strengthen those connections, drive the innovation we need and invite our residents into the world of water research."

In 2016, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) teamed with the City of Chicago and World Business Chicago to launch Current, Chicago's nonprofit water innovation hub and the organizer of Chicago Water Week. "The Chicago region's water resources have global significance," said MWRD President Kari K. Steele. "Thanks to 131 years of partnerships, innovation, determination, science, engineering and advocacy for our water environment, the MWRD, City of Chicago and partners have transformed a swampy wetland into a bustling metropolitan region. We appreciate Current as it is vital that we work together to protect our water resources for future generations."

The event is presented by Greeley and Hansen. "As a global engineering firm solely focused on water-related engineering that's been headquartered in Chicago for over 100 years, we're very proud to continue to support Current in presenting this important water sector event," said John C.
